August is a great month to begin planning ahead for fall mite treatments and gathering equipment needed for winterizing and fall feeding. It's hard to believe that we'll be talking about winterizing in the next couple of months.

The club conducted a Honey Harvest workshop on July 20th at Gary & Tami Wylie's barn. The activity was well attended by 30 members who provided positive comments at the conclusion of the workshop. The workshop began with a detailed honey frame removal and extraction video, and also included honey extraction equipment, honey containers, bottling and labeling, warmers and honey marketing.

A reminder about the August meeting, we're planning an open microphone discussion night. Come with your questions and be prepared to participate. This is what makes our club unique, is our ability to share experiences and knowledge with one another.
