Turkey comes in second with 144,000 tons with 8 million hives, followed by Argentina with 80,000 tons produced by 2 million hives. The U.S. is ranked ninth among the world's honey producers with 2.8 million hives.

Swarm List – Honey Bee Swarm Removal

Bees will swarm in the spring and early summer. If you find a swarm of bees clustered on a tree or a bush give one of us a call. We will be glad to remove the swarm at no cost to you. We do not remove hornets, paper wasps, or yellow jacket nests. They are in the wasp family and are not the same as honey bees. The list below will help you to call someone in your area. We cover Erie, Huron, Ottawa, Sandusky, Seneca, and Wood counties.

Check and make sure the swarm are honey bees. Yellow jackets, wasps, and hornets are often mistaken for honey bees.



Below are some additional helpful suggestions to provide to the person who may come to remove the swarm.

How high is the swarm off the ground? (knee high, waist high, chest high, above the head?)

What is the swarm attached to? (branch-diameter of branch?, bush, underside of something?)

What size is the swarm? (softball, soccer ball, football, basketball, larger?)

How long ago did the swarm land? (hour, few hours, a day, several days?)

What is the property address of the swarm? (specific directions to know?)

How can you be reached? (phone, email?)

How accessible is the swarm? (close to the road, backyard, can a vehicle get close to the swarm?)

Be prepared to provide/send a picture of the swarm that needs to be removed. Please note – once a swarm moves into a hollow tree or wall it is no longer a swarm. The swarm has found its permanent home at this point.
