Droppings from the President February/March 2025

With the strange winter temperatures swings, I am sure we all are itching to check the girls and get a start on the upcoming season butttt....not so fast friends, looking at the next couple of weeks (accu-weather-guesser) and the month ahead, it's not warm enough for me to be pulling boxes apart, not yet. Feeding and keeping entrances cleaned will be the most of my activities at least until the temps get above 60F.

I have been listening to quite a few interviews on the colony deaths being reported by the commercial beekeepers. It seems they noticed bee deaths last fall, but things got more serious with more reports and huge losses in December and January. The testing and investigation is on going and of course many people are speculating CCD among other things. As a note, CCD, Colony Collapse Disorder, had no one definitive causation. Some report there is no recovery from the current number of losses, others report it is not as bad as 'they' are saying. My best guess: ask ten beekeepers a questions and you will get ten different views or speculations. Kidding aside, this is a fairly serious situation; huge losses for the pollinators, possible food supply problems(?) and most likely an increase of food prices. And possibly, as Dana Stahlman suggested, a short supply of packages or nuc availability? Dana advised to order early for those whom may e wanting nucs or packages this spring. While waiting for the official report we can only do our best with our girls through proper hive management: integrated pest management to control mite loads, requeening when brood pattern or behavior is off, feed and split as necessary.

The Education/Workshop Committee is in process and headed by Gary Wylie.

Mentoring Committee — I want to encourage anyone who has 3 or more years as a beekeeper to consider sharing your experiences with others and sign up as a Mentor. Bee-ing a mentor or participating in the mentoring committee only requires you to have a desire to learn new things as you are teaching new things because we don't truly know how much we do know unless we try to help someone else. It is a two-way learning and teaching experience.

The success of our club will depend on how much and what we, as members, put into it.
