- ⇒ Remove winter wrap
- ⇒ Place honey supers on an established hive
- ⇒ Remove mouse guards
- ⇒ Rotate hive bodies if brood is in top box
- ⇒ Check for swarm cells along bottom of frames
- ⇒ Prepare for swarm season
- ⇒ Make splits
- ⇒ **Attend bee club meetings**
