Bees and their honey play an essential role in ancient Greek myths and religious traditions. One Greek story tells of the birth of Zeus, King of the Gods. The cave was full of sacred bees that fed honey to the infant. Once Zeus was grown up, he dethroned Kronos and awarded the bees for their assistance by making them bright gold and strong enough to resist cold and winds.
